Introduction

The main purpose of this bibliography is to assist Canadians of Ukrainian origin in their research and writing of their Ukrainian family history. Most of the titles on Ukrainian Canadian family history mentioned in this bibliography are preserved at the Library and Archives Canada in Ottawa. The publications included in this bibliography are written in English. Those family histories published in Ukrainian, on web pages or in other formats may be included in future editions of this bibliography. Memoirs, local, organizational and school histories are not included.

This publication can be an important source for those researchers who are beginning their investigations and are preparing a research plan. It can also assist researchers to locate information on families with the same surnames, departing from the same villages in Ukraine, settling in the same areas in Canada and hopefully, they may be related.

Researchers are encouraged to publish the results of their research on their Ukrainian family history in the form of a publication. The publications listed in this bibliography provide a wide range of types of family histories. Some are fairly basic and are produced in the form of a family photo album while others are elaborate books with the detailed history of individuals and families including photographs, copies of documents, maps, family tree charts, a bibliography and a nominal index.

At least two copies of these publications should be deposited either with the Library and Archives Canada in Ottawa, the provincial library in their home province, provincial genealogical society or a public library closer to home. Once the publication is catalogued, it will be included in holdings of a library and through the internet, will make researchers aware of this book not only in Canada but also in other countries including Ukraine.

The publications are described according to a number of citations that are generally common in all publications: titles, author, date of publication etc. In some cases, the author did not include certain citations in their family history and, of course, this information is not included in the description of the specific publication in this bibliography. The publications are listed in a

general alphabetical order according to the surname of the family and are numbered accordingly. The spelling of names of families are included as published in the family histories. In some case, the names of places in Ukraine were transliterated according to a modified Library of Congress system but in most cases were left as they appeared in the publications. Some place-names were included in Polish.

A few books held at the Library and Archives Canada could not be reviewed due to their transfer to new storage facilities.

Please note that the numbers in the nominal index, places in Ukraine and in Canada are the numbers of the publications listed in this bibliography and are not the page numbers.

Citations

Title: Since most of the research regarding family histories is now conducted through the internet, library catalogues are among the first sources of information that are consulted by researchers. The title of a publication is usually the first category that researchers search in any catalogue or bibliography. To facilitate their research and to locate publications quickly, authors of family histories are strongly encouraged to include the name or names of their family in the title of the publication. Although there is a tendency, as seen in this bibliography, to include poetic and sentimental titles, the lack of a family name complicates the search in the catalogue of any library.

Author: The author of a family history should be clearly identified on the cover and title page of a family history. If there is more than one author or the publication was prepared by a committee, all their names should be included. This information will allow the researcher to determine if the publication was prepared by a family member, someone related to the family or by a professional author who was hired for this specific purpose. Names of compilers, research assistants, proofreaders and editors should also be included.

Publisher: In most cases, the publisher of a family history is the author, a committee or a family history and reunion group. Since the number of copies printed is usually very limited, most commercial publishers are hesitant to

undertake this kind of project. This information is important if the reader would like to obtain further copies of the family history.

Place of Publisher: However, there are some commercial publishers who have published family histories and this information may assist other researchers when they are selecting a publisher. The publisher will normally advise the author on the production of the book that is usually of a higher standard and quality.

Printer: Including the name of the printer on the title page will inform the reader if the publication was published with a commercial printer or locally though a local printer. If the publication was printed by a local printer, researchers may consider selecting the same printer for their own purposes depending on the quality of their work. In some cases, the author has decided for reasons of economy and convenience to print the publication at a local printer/photocopier and this information should be mentioned in an introduction to the book. The number of copies printed should also be mentioned to provide the reader with an estimate of the number of copies in circulation and its availability.

Date: The date of the publication should be included on the title page. This will inform the reader about the recent quality of the information, the years in circulation and whether the publication is a first edition or a subsequent edition.

Pages: All publications should be paginated in sequence. This will assist the reader to locate information on specific individuals and events and also, with the preparation of an index, if possible.

Photographs: Almost all publications contain photographs of family members and events. All photographs should be identified with the names of the individuals, location and date. If this information is unavailable, then the lack or uncertainty of information should be mentioned regarding specific photographs. If possible, ownership and location of the original photographs should be mentioned.

Family Tree Charts: This is a very useful method of presenting information on a family and their relationships. Family tree charts may be presented in several forms and styles as long as several generations and their relationship are included. Readers can at a glance, determine the relationship of an

individual to the rest of the family. Several generations of a family are usually included and in this manner, it is possible to identify cousins, aunts, uncles and other relatives.

Maps: In almost every family history, a map is included. Usually it is a map of the location of the ancestral village in Ukraine. Researchers should attempt to include a map with the location of this village or town with transliterated names in English of locations. If this is not possible, then a map in Ukrainian will assist the reader if the names are transliterated into English. To assist the reader to locate the village on a larger map, the author should ensure that the village is depicted with the local town or city that can be located on a larger map. In some cases, there are more than one village and town in Ukraine with the same name. Most of the Ukrainians who immigrated to Canada came from small villages that cannot be located on any map. Today, there are detailed maps for tourists that are very useful in locating these villages.

In many of the same publications, maps are included of the locations settled in Canada. Ukrainians from the first wave of immigration settled in remote areas with place names that no longer appear on any map. Again, the authors should include on the same map, the location of the nearest large town or city.

Index: Some authors have made an effort to include an index at the end of the publication. An index of names of individuals mentioned in the publication will greatly assist any reader searching for information on their own family. In this index, names of individuals should be included but also place names and if possible, events, anniversaries and related information.

Bibliography: In some publications, the authors have included a bibliography of their sources. This is very useful to any reader to locate information in an archive, research institution, genealogical society or library. In some cases, the authors relied on information published in earlier family histories that is also useful information. Titles of unpublished memoirs and family histories are especially valuable. Names of family members who were interviewed for this project should also be included.

Call Number: The call number is included in each description of a family history to assist the reader to locate this publication in a library. The call number can also inform the reader whether the publication is in a library,

special collection or in a rare book or preservation collection. If a publication is held in a rare book collection of an institution, it is not normally lent through the inter-library loan system.

Location of publication: Some of these publications are found in one or two libraries and are considered as ‘rare books.’ This information along with the call number will assist the reader to identify the publication if they wish to order the publication through the inter-library loan system.

From: The place of origin of a family in what is now Ukraine is one of the basic facts that must be included in any family history. The spelling of the village, town or locality may vary and all versions should be included especially the spelling in Cyrillic or Ukrainian alphabet. This will assist the readers and other family members to correctly identify the location of the village if they wish to visit. In many cases, there are several villages in Ukraine with the same name or names that are approximate in spelling. If possible, these other villages should also be included and the correct one identified. A map of this village should be included to assist in the correct location of the village.

Settled: Another basic fact that must be included in any family history is the place of settlement in Canada. In some cases, the areas settled were still ‘unorganized’ and the settlers provided their own place names usually in Ukrainian. As the settlements became more organized with a school, post office and railway station, other names became the ‘official’ names that could be found on maps of that period. All names both formal and informal should be included in a family history.

Names: To assist any reader to locate surnames that may be of interest, an index of family names, locations in Ukraine and Canada is included in this publication. These are also surnames that are found in each family history usually names of wives who are spouses of the men in this family. It should be noted that all names were not included and readers should examine the names of locations in Ukraine and Canada for further research or if these early pioneers shared the same experiences of departure from Ukraine and arrival in Canada as the reader’s family. For the purposes of this bibliography, only descendants of the early pioneers with Ukrainian surnames were included in the nominal index.
