How to Interpret Birth, Marriage and Death Records

This meeting dealt with the topic that was originally scheduled for the January meeting but was postponed due to the weather. The topic, *How to Interpret Birth, Marriage and Death Records*, was originally presented at the Toronto Ukrainian Genealogy Group meeting on September 12, 2017.

Sample of Ukrainian Church Birth Records

This was a power point presentation that began with an historical outline of the Greek Catholic Church in Galicia (Halychyna) and, using actual Church documents, explained naming customs, surnames, birth/baptismal records, house numbers, names of baptized, religion, among other information on the various forms. Documents dealing with Marriage Records and

Death Records were also presented and explained.

In all cases, some familiarity with Church traditions and practices including some knowledge of basic Latin would be useful in understanding the information in these documents. Access to these Church documents is vital if anyone wishes to research their family history in Ukraine during the last two centuries. It is possible that the local Family History Centre may provide access to these documents from specific parishes in Ukraine which should be available in electronic format.

Mike Dowhan commented on additional documents based on his research. As well Stuart Fedak and Frank Cedar also provided additional documents from their families. The meeting concluded with a question and answer period.

For those members who are interested in the history of the Ukrainian community in Quebec, the PhD dissertation by Prof. Yarema Gregory Kelebay, available in electronic format, may be of some interest.

The dissertation entitled, *The Ideological and Intellectual Baggage of Three Fragments of Ukrainian Immigration: A Contribution to the History of Ukrainians in Quebec (1910-1960)*, [PhD, Concordia University, Montreal, 1992] /electronic resource/ deals with the political history of the three waves of Ukrainian immigration to Canada in particular, to Montreal. Prof. Kelebay mentions the names of some of the early pioneers in Montreal and explains the political and religious divisions in the community.
