Radomir Bilash holds a Masters degree in Anthropology from the University of Manitoba and is Senior Historian with the Historic Sites & Cultural Facilities Branch, Alberta Ministry of Community Development. He has been associated with the Ukrainian Cultural Heritage Village (open air museum) since 1977, and was an integral team-member involved in the relocation of St. Onufrius Ukrainian Catholic Church from Barich, Alberta to the Canadian Museum of Civilization in 1996. Throughout his career, he has undertaken extensive research in the Ukrainian communities of western Canada, as well as in the villages in the regions of Halychyna and Bukovyna in western Ukraine. He also continues the ethno-historical research of St. Onufrius church. Mr. Bilash has taught courses on Ukrainian Canadian Ethnography, and currently teaches a course in Early Ukrainian Canadian Culture in the Slavics Studies Unit of the Dept. of Modern Languages & Cultures, University of Alberta. He is also president of the Canadian Association of Ukrainian Ethnology.
