# January 25, 2004 Meeting

The historical documentary, Between Hitler and Stalin - Ukraine in World War II The Untold Story by S. Nowytski, made in Toronto, was viewed at the January meeting followed by a discussion.

This one-hour documentary is narrated by Jack Palance and portrays the epic struggle on the territory of Ukraine between Nazi Germany and Soviet Russia.

The destructive scorched earth policy of both powers, the Ukrainian guerilla armies, the people fighting both oppressors for Ukrainian independence are woven together with historical information.

The film shows witness interviews, historical analysis, archival movie footage from German and Soviet sources and archival material fo reflect parts of the story of WWII. (In English)

# "Zabuzanskie" Archives

The Polish Archives now has a searchable online database of the so called "Zabuzanskie" Archives.

PRADZIAD - the Data base has 1794 Galician Greek Catholic and 2708 Roman Catholic films listed. It is at:

Those who have not been able to locate Galician records using the LDS catalogue might find them in the "Zabuzanskie" Archives. Unfortunately you cannot view the microfilms unless you plan a trip to Poland. However, you can order up copies of records from the Archives.
