November, 2009 Meeting

At the meeting held on November 24, we were able to screen the historical documentary, *Harvest Of Despair* (*Ukrainian Famine/Holodomor*)

This film documents the Ukrainian Famine of 1932--33, which caused the deaths directly and indirectly, of over seven million people in Soviet Ukraine. Yury Luhovy, who produced this documentary, used interviews with survivors, researchers and scholars to supplement rare photographic evidence.

The film established that the Famine was deliberately organized by the Soviet Government as part of Stalin's effort to control and subdue the Ukrainian peasants, who resisted the forced collectivization of their farms. This Famine was kept a secret by the Soviet Government which denied any outside assistance of food because "there was no famine'. The Soviets claimed that any mention of the Famine both inside and outside Ukraine, was anti-Soviet propaganda and this position was maintained until the collapse of the Soviet Union in 1991.

The film has received many international awards (including an Academy Award

nomination) and has been featured on the PBS television network. Yury Luhovy has produced a more recent documentary on the Famine. He has traveled to Ukraine to interview survivors and witnesses to this tragedy. An English-language version of the new documentary is in preparation.

This session was concluded with a question and answer period.

This site is a short-cut to various databases. In particular, this site includes information on access to the Ellis Island Search Forms and Ship Arrivals, Other Ports of Immigration (mostly USA) but what is of particular interest is: Holocaust and Eastern Europe. This site which is near the bottom of the page, includes Siberian Refugee Camps, Soviet Gulags and Russia's Fallen.

You can check for your surname in Russia's Fallen (the surname is changed to Cyrillic on this site). This is a list of those soldiers who perished during the Second World War. It is also possible to view the original handwritten document where additional information can be seen.
