<u>Presentation by Borys Sirskyj on the Halychyna</u> Division

At our February meeting, Borys Sirskyj gave a very interesting presentation on the Halychyna Division during the Second World War.

He gave an overview of the historical background to the political situation in western Ukraine at the beginning of the Second World War. He outlined the various choices confronted by the Ukrainian nationalist youth at that time and why some chose to join this military unit under German command in 1943 and 1944. Some joined out of a sense of Ukrainian patriotism in an effort to have a Ukrainian military presence in eastern Europe so that there would be a Ukrainian voice in determining the outcome of the war. This unit had military chaplains and was essentially a military unit.

At the end of the war, this unit surrendered to the British military in Austria and they were interned in Rimini, Italy and later in Great Britain. The unit was 'civilianized' in 1948-1949 and individual members were allowed to immigrate to Canada in the early 1950's. In Canada, they formed their own veterans' association. In the 1980's members of this unit were subject to investigation by the Canadian federal government due to accusations that some were 'war criminals' but no evidence was produced. Borys also brought some of the publications written about the history of this unit.

<u>Publications on Ukrainian Canadians and</u> Ukraine

On the Ourroots.ca website, there is a fully searchable collection of local history publications which have been scanned page by page. There are several publications about Ukrainian pioneers in Western Canada.

On the webpage in the upper right corner, there is a box under 'Look for a Book' and 'Search'. Enter 'Ukrainian' or 'Ukraine' for a listing of books on Ukrainian Canadian pioneers.

Written in 1985 for the Ukrainian pioneer village in Alberta, "Galicia and Bukovina: a research handbook about Western Ukraine, late 19th and 20th century" published in 1990, is fully searchable and printable!

This is a 200+ page scholarly work about Galicia and its gubernias. Particular maps drawn for the handbook showing Galician administrative changes have been online:

The author is John-Paul Himka, a professor of History at the University of Alberta. He has coauthored a short pamphlet on Ukrainian genealogy as well as numerous articles for Encyclopaedia of Ukraine (University of Toronto Press).

The book has more than 600 bibliographic references about the social and political history of the Ukraine.
