## February 22, 2004 Meeting

At the February meeting we viewed two videos on Jewish family history research in Ukraine:

"How to Trace Your Jewish Roots - A journey with Arthur Kurzweil" and

"Routes to Routes - A Time to Gather Stones - with Miriam Weiner".

In the first video, Arthur Kurzweil summarized some of the steps to begin your family history research:

- 1. Talk to relatives both immediate family and distant relatives
- 2. Identify the relatives who immigrated to Canada and when
- 3. Attempt to locate naturalization/citizenship records of relatives
- 4. Check passenger lists of ships that brought your relatives to Canada including later arrivals
- 5. Attempt to locate local histories of areas settled in Canada and also books about ancestral villages, counties, oblasts in Ukraine
- 5. Use your local library to locate newspapers for obituaries, census data, city directories, maps
- 6. Try to locate photographs and use them to identify family members
- 7. Check cemetery records for information birth and death dates, other family members
- 8. Contact any relatives still alive in Ukraine

9. Check your local family History Center (Mormons) for these and other sources

The most popular sources are still on the internet and by checking Google and CyndisList you can locate many other sources.
