February Meeting

Prof. Serhii Cipko gave an interesting presentation with slides on Ukrainians in South America more specifically in Paraguay. From 1880 until 1914 thousands of Ukrainians settled in Brazil, Argentina and Paraguay. During the years 1927-1939 about ten thousand more settled in these countries.

Community organizations and churches were established which received a new wave of Ukrainian Displaced Persons in the years after the Second World War. Many of the first immigrants arrived from Volynia and Polissia. These Ukrainians tended to settle in agricultural communities. Others settled in the larger urban centers and worked as general labourers.

In the 1950's some of the Ukrainians returned to the Soviet Union as part of the 'Return to the Homeland' movement. In the 1990's there was another wave of Ukrainian immigration after the independence of Ukraine.

With a growing number of Ukrainians living in urban centers, most integrate into the local society and work in various professions. They speak Spanish in Argentina, Uruguay, and Paraguay and Portuguese in Brazil. Many adopt local Christian names and customs although most retain their Ukrainian surnames.
