<u>Guidebooks for tourists traveling by car prepared</u> <u>for Euro 2012</u>

A guidebook entitled "Ukraine 2012" has been prepared for tourists traveling by car to the Euro 2012 European Football Championship.

The guidebook is based on a survey carried out by the Consumer Expertise Center of the Nash Produkt (Our Product) Editorial Group.

According to Director General of the Nash Produkt Editorial Group Oleksandr Dranykov, the guidebook will contain addresses, phone numbers of catering and accommodation facilities, car service stations, banks, and all of the routes by road to the cities that will host the championship.

He also said that the guidebooks would contain reports on private trips to the places by representatives of the consumer expertise center.

The guidebook will also include materials on historical and cultural sites of the cities that will host the Euro 2012. The book will consist of four sections: maps, routes, infrastructure, and services and entertainment.

According to Dranykov, the guidebook will be sold to European tourists traveling by car. The book will have 364 pages in A4 format. Each book will cost EUR 5-8.
