Feb 26th 2019 Meeting

Report on the Nashi Predky Fall Conference (and Archives/Museum)

Mike Dowhan reported on the Nashi Predky Ukrainian Family History conference that he attended last fall in Somerset, New Jersey.

Nashi Predky is a genealogical organization founded in 2014 whose goal is to assist their members learn about their Ukrainian family histories, trace their lineages, and to document/preserve family records. Mike Dowhan – our February speaker

The fall conference featured 9 presentations. One speaker delivered 3 "virtual" presentations from Budapest covering recent Family Research developments in Ukraine in general as well more detailed updates on topics specific to the Galacia/Bukovyna and Transcarpathia regions.

Another interesting presentation Mike attended featured a speaker explaining the techniques he used to augment earlier research originally compiled by his Aunt regarding their ethnic German family from a town near L'viv. He then explained the various approaches and tools he used to self-publish a book on the family story through on-line resources.

There was also a presentation on the use Social Media, DNA testing/tools, and collaborative efforts to assist researchers identify potential Lemko cousins and common ancestors. The 2nd day of the conference featured 3 presentations on the use of DNA testing to support genealogical research, as well as considerations pertaining to research standards, as well as legal and ethical issues. Each conference presentation was accompanied by handouts with extensive bibliographies and websites.

Mike also described the organization which hosted the conference - *Ukrainian History and Education Center (UHEC)* – with an overview of their facilities, museum, and archival resources. See: https://www.ukrhec.org/

As a final note, our UGG-NCR has begun a collaboration with Nashi Predky in 2019, with UGG making a virtual presentation to Nashi Predky on June 29 on "*Ukrainian-Canadian Genealogy*", and Nashi Predky presenting "*Historical Overview of Ukrainians in America*" at our Oct 22 meeting.
