

#### April 25 2017 Meeting

Book Launch: A Canadian Hero: Cpl Filip Konowal, VC and the Battle of Hill 70

This event was a book launch by Prof. Lubomyr Luciuk of his recent book, *A Canadian Hero: Cpl Filip Konowal, VC and the Battle of Hill 70.* The life and career of Konowal is of special interest to the Ukrainian community in Ottawa because Konowal lived in Ottawa before and after his service during the First World War and his funeral was conducted from the St. John the Baptist Ukrainian Catholic parish in 1959.

Prof. Luciuk has been researching the life of Konowal for many years and described various incidents relating to his career. He explained how he was involved in locating the Victoria Cross won by Konowal and preserved at the Canadian War Museum but went missing in 2004. It seems that the medal was stolen and later offered for sale by auction. Prof. Luciuk was able to arrange the return of this medal and restore it to the Canadian War Museum.

Prof. Luciuk briefly described the life of Konowal from his origins in Ukraine to his military exploits in France during the First World War. Konowal was seriously wounded in France and this affected his behaviour after he returned to Canada. Eventually he was able to secure employment as a Commissionaire on Parliament Hill.

Prof. Luciuk described his family life in Ottawa and also his contacts with the Ukrainian Canadian veterans from the Second World War. Various plaques and memorials have been erected in honour of Konowal both in Canada and in Ukraine. The latest project is the monument erected to commemorate the 100th Anniversary of the Battle of Hill 70 in France where Konowal won his Victoria Cross. A Konowal Walk is part of this monument and it will be officially opened on August 22, 2017.

Prof. Luciuk described memorial projects concerning Ukrainian Canadian veterans of the Second World War in England. He had several copies of his book and all were sold at the meeting. The presentation was followed by a question-and-answer period. This meeting was cosponsored by the UGG-NCR and the Ottawa branch of the Ukrainian Canadian Professional and Business Association (UCPBA).
