October 24 2017 Meeting

Ukrainian DNA

The topic, *Ukrainian DNA*, continues to be a popular subject among our members and we had another large turnout for this meeting. For our February, 2017 meeting we had invited Christine Downs to provide a basic introduction to DNA research. For this meeting, we invited a panel of four presenters and each gave a summary of their research interests, their DNA test results and plans for further research.



Ukrainian DNA Panel Discussion - October 2017

Mike Dowhan, who received the latest results from his DNA test, described the procedure for submitting his DNA sample which was analyzed in Ireland. His results were described in percentages and confirmed the information based on his own research regarding his family tree to date. The results also provided information on other individuals with close similarities to his DNA results and among them was Gary Filmon, former Premier of Manitoba.

Richard Mischook took the DNA test to confirm some of the information about the family origins on his father's side. Previous information that his grandfather was of Ukrainian origin and his grandmother was of Jewish origin was confirmed by the test results.

Irena Bell was interested in the origins of her family name which suggested that the ancestor was a 'newcomer or stranger.' Her DNA test results suggested origins in the Balkans. Irena speculated that this individual was possibly someone who escaped compulsory recruitment into the Turkish military and made his way to Halychyna.

Brian Bullock discovered as a teenager that he was adopted and this revelation led to his lifelong search for his birth parents. After several years of research and making contacts, he was able to identify his birth family. But during these early years, he had interesting encounters with individuals who later turned out to be relatives. His DNA results confirmed the results of his own research. All presenters stated that they were satisfied with the results of their DNA tests and encouraged members to also take this test. This panel discussion was followed by a question and answer period.

If there are other members that plan to take the DNA test, it may be possible to arrange another meeting on the subject of Ukrainian DNA in the new year.
