Report on a Research Trip to Poland and Ukraine

Myron Momryk gave a report on his research trip to Poland and Ukraine, August 3-26, 2018. Myron attended the International Association of Jewish Genealogical Societies Conference in Warsaw, August 5-10, 2018. At this conference, he was particularly interested in sessions devoted to the search for archival sources on Ukrainian family history in Galicia (Halychyna).
