May 28th 2019 Meeting

The Ukrainian Presidential Election

The topic of the May meeting was the Ukrainian Presidential Election held on March 31 and April 21 on a two-round system. The presenters were Ihor Michalchyshyn, CEO Ukrainian Canadian Congress National, Vilyen Pidgornyy, Ukrainian Canadian Congress Media Contact and Borys Sirskyj, Election Observer.

Vilyen began the presentation by providing an outline of the three branches of the Ukrainian Government – Legislative, Executive and Judicial. He described the powers of the President who appoints the Cabinet Ministers with the approval of the Rada (Legislature) and is also responsible for National Defence and Foreign Affairs. The members of the Rada are elected for a term of five years. Ihor described the role of the Prime Minister and Cabinet. He provided brief biographical notes on the three main candidates, Volodymyr Zelensky, Petro Poroshenko and Yulia Tymoshenko. eMail: uggncr1@gmail.com Editor: Mike Dowhan (613) 822-7293

He also gave an analysis of the election results that were compared to previous Presidential Elections in 2014. Vilyen provided some information on the campaign styles of each candidate. Ihor spoke on the results of the exit poll and on the first and second rounds of the election.

Borys Sirskyj described the role of the Election Observers and the delegation from Canada. He outlined the mandate and mission of the Observers and their goal to be impartial, neutral and independent. He worked in the Zakarpatia region (on the western border of Ukraine) and described the local campaign, the minority groups including the local Hungarians and Roma. Despite bad roads and difficult travel conditions, Borys met with the local cultural communities, government officials, organizations and individual electors. The local TV stations were owned by the oligarchs and were anti-Poroshenko. He mentioned his activities during the two rounds of the election. He was very busy during the two elections and had to visit as many polls as possible.

Volodymyr Zelensky won this election with 73% of the vote. The meeting was concluded by a question-and-answer session.
